JANUARY

Tuesday 13th, 2pm Clarendon Palace - A Royal Ruin - Talk by Dr Cindy Wood

On the outskirts of Salisbury is the royal deer park of Clarendon, with the former royal palace placed centrally within it. This was once the largest royal site in the southwest, and in medieval times a regular stop for the monarchy on their travels across England. Clarendon was the site of many important events and legislation, and this talk will consider the palace site, its significance, along with its sad decline from the reign of Henry VII. This is a little-known site today but was once surprisingly as important as Windsor Castle and the Palace of Westminster!

Winter Walk Around Milton Abbas - Approx. 7 miles

Aviation Around Poole Bay 1910 to 1976 - Talk by Kevin Patience

A sixty-year odyssey of the important part Poole Bay and its surrounds played in the story of aircraft and the men who flew around this part of Dorset for over 6O years between 191O and 1976. The seaplanes and flying boats of B.O.A.C., the Royal Air Force and the Royal Navy in Poole Harbour.

The Voyage of Molly - Talk by Steve Richardson

The ports of London, Liverpool and Bristol are known for their involvement in the trading of enslaved people, but many smaller British ports were also engaged in this trade. Some of Dorset's ports were involved, with one ship called Molly making several voyages from Poole during the 175Os. With the help of archive records some of these journeys have been pieced together. But Molly was just one ship making a handful of voyages out of a total of more than 12,000 by British ships. What was Molly's fate? How was it procured? And how did Molly's voyages fit into the wider "triangular trade" of the time?

While working as a volunteer researcher at the Bankes Archive, David was inspired to write the remarkable and sad story of John Bankes (1937-1996), son of the last owner of Kingston Lacy. Privileged and conventionally educated, he was on track to inherit the fabulous house and estate. But John was alienated from his native Dorset and died in isolation in London, with the latter half of his life marred by deep personal sorrow and material neglect.

Tuesday 24th, 2pm From Bombs to Bournville... - Talk by Helen Baggot





Moignes Court is the oldest inhabited house in Dorset with records showing it was built in 1267. The Cree family bought the house in 1826 and have continued to live there for 8 generations. The tour will also include the old kitchen and 1st floor courtroom in the house. Refreshments will be served before the tour. There is no coach to this property.

In 1946, a patrolling police constable was murdered in Burton-on-Trent as he walked his beat during the silent hours. He had disturbed a burglar. It would take 10 years to bring the suspected offender before the courts but not before a world-wide manhunt, including the personal intervention of J Edgar Hoover, Head of the FBI. This presentation exposes post-war attitudes towards American GIs who had remained in Britain after the war.






